




If you hear your local Public Warning Sirens sound for an unusually long time, and it is not the first Friday of the month, April through October, it is a **REAL EMERGENCY**.


These warnings not only alert you of inclement weather; the situation could be a **CHEMICAL EMERGENCY**.



### **DO NOT CALL 911**

Turn to your local TV or radio station. Emergency agencies work with the media to keep you informed with necessary information.

**DO NOT CALL 911** to ask questions. Call only if you need the police, fire, or paramedics for an emergency.



### **LISTEN CAREFULLY**

**to the news media. Be sure that you find out:**

- **What is happening?**
- **Where is it happening?**
- **Will it involve you?**
- **What do you have to do?**



If you are told to stay where you are, use the Shelter-in-Place Checklist to be sure that you know what to do.



If you are told to leave, use the Evacuation Checklist to be sure that you evacuate safely.

### **KEEP IN TOUCH**

Stay near a TV or radio and listen for further instructions.
